Life Guards:	Bathing suit, guard shirt
Service Desk:	BAC vest, or BAC shirt, athletic pants, name tag <i>No hats, sweatpants, hoodies, or jeans are allowed.</i>
Child Care:	BAC staff shirt or jacket <i>No hats, sweatpants, or jeans are allowed.</i>
Membership:	Professional attire, or BAC vest. If a PT...PT uniform <i>No hats, sweatpants, hoodies, or jeans are allowed.</i>
Fitness:	BAC vest, or PT shirt with black, blue, or gray athletic pants, name tag
Group Fitness:	Professional group exercise attire for the type of class being offered.
Salon & Spa:	Professional attire, with Solei Salon smock worn over clothing.
Facilities:	BAC attire.
